What an extremely busy summer our emergency services have had! It seemed that every day sirens were blaring and ambulances and fire appliances were heading out to deal with events.

Tairua St John's volunteer station co-ordinator, Kathryn Gillingham gave us a rundown of their response workload from December to February, a total of 82 callouts! The calls were to medical emergencies and accidents. It is worth noting that on several days they attended multiple events in quick succession.

The crews travelled as far north as Kuaotunu, and as far south as Pauanui and Whangamata. Kathryn reported that the public always reacted positively to the medics when they arrived at each of their jobs. She did, however, want to remind drivers that when they see flashing lights and hear sirens behind them they are expected to pull over and stop to let emergency vehicles through. And I would add, be mindful at the one way bridges that emergency vehicles take precedence, always.



Powerco Community Fund applications open

Powerco, New Zealand's largest dual electricity and gas distributor by network length, has opened applications for the first round of its Community Fund. This year, the Powerco Community Fund is split into two funding rounds, one in March and the second in August, to make it easier for community groups to access timely funding for projects that are important to their communities. Applications for round one can be made between 3 March and 31 March for projects to be delivered between June and November this year.

Powerco is looking for projects run by the community for the community, particularly in the smaller towns and regions it serves. Since the Powerco Community Fund was first launched in 2023, the company has aimed to assist the groups and organisations
